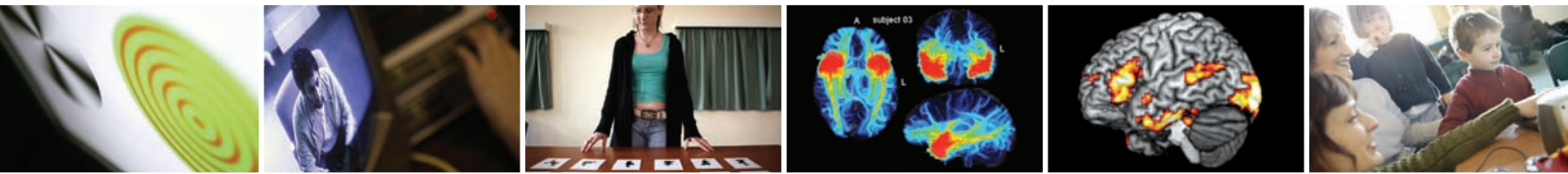

## Masters in Clinical and Health Psychology

This course is designed for students hoping to pursue a career in clinical or health psychology

Students will gain a thorough grounding in:

- Contemporary theories of the psychology of physical and mental health problems.
- The principles and evidence-base of psychological interventions at the individual, group and population level.
- The role of psychologists within healthcare settings such as the NHS and how the science of psychology is applied in clinical practice

## Masters in Cognitive Brain Imaging

This course is aimed at students planning to use functional neuroimaging as a research tool in fields such as cognitive, social or clinical neuroscience, computational modelling and medicine.

Students will acquire the necessary methodological and theoretical skills to equip them for high-level functional imaging research using fMRI, PET and EEG. The course is strongly lab-based and offers extensive hands-on experience as well as a solid grounding in theory.

Major areas covered include: Imaging Techniques, Image Analysis Methods, Experimental design, Cognitive Science, Functional Neuroanatomy and Cognitive and Clinical Neuroscience Theory. In addition, students will have the opportunity to acquire direct fMRI research experience by way of their final research project.

## Masters in Research Methods in Psychology

This course provides in-depth theoretical understanding, factual knowledge base, and practical experience of key research paradigms, research designs, and statistical techniques used in psychology, and more broadly, in the social sciences.

- It is recognised by the ESRC as providing the one-year, Masters-level postgraduate training which constitutes the first year of the ESRC 1+3 postgraduate studentships for full-time, part-time and CASE students.
- applicable to professionals in the social or health services, or in marketing and cognate disciplines, whose career development demands a research component.

All courses involve a diverse range of teaching and learning methods, including problem-based learning, small group teaching and online support.
